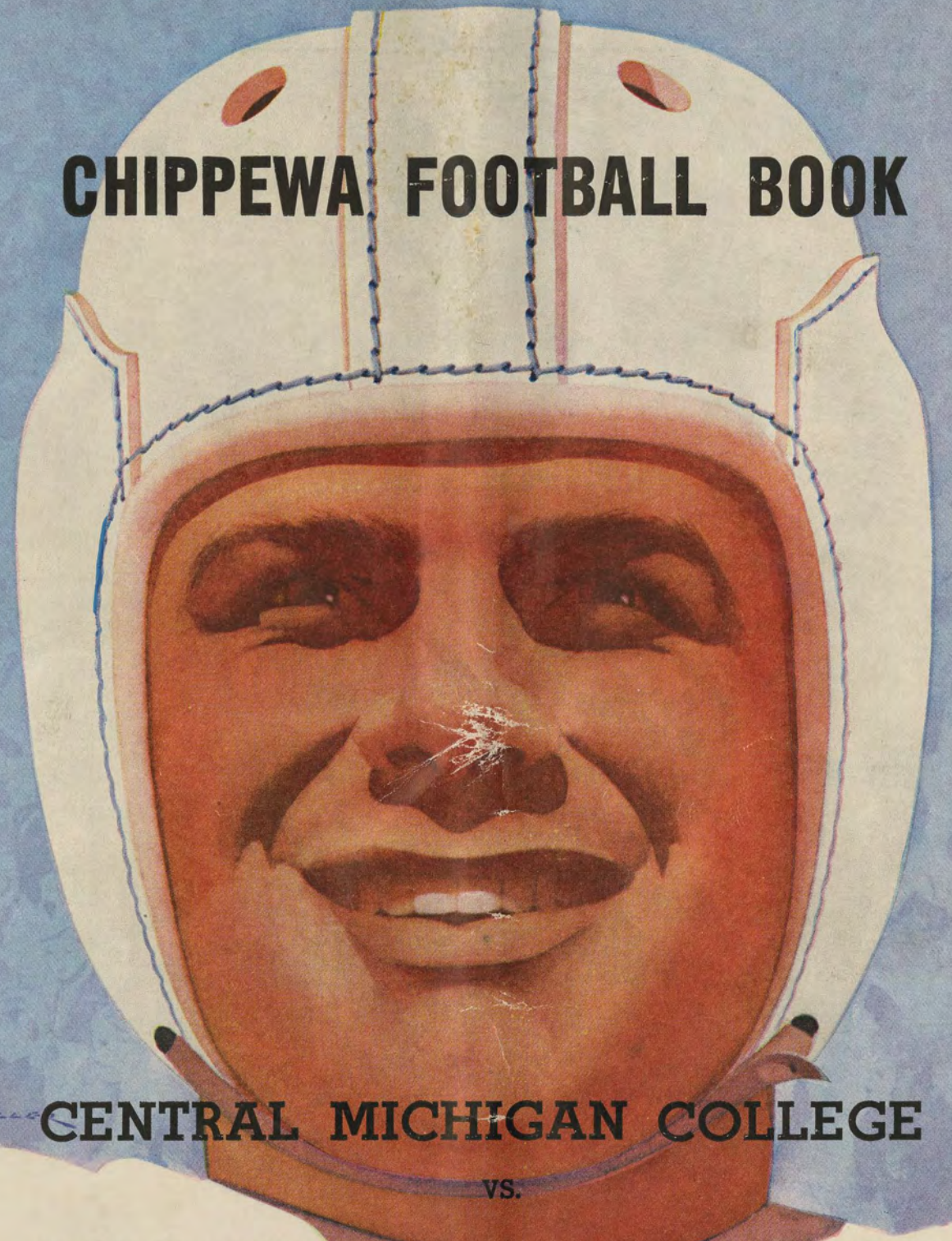

## The Chippewa Coaching Staff

Starting his tenth year as head football coach at Central Michigan College, Ronald W. Finch has amassed the most enviable record of all the Chippewa football coaches. In his nine years here, he has brought the Chips 46 victories, while suffering only 16 defeats and one tie. Under his tutelage the Braves have run up a total of 1067 points, while their opponents have scored 465.

A keen student of sports, Ron excels in analysis of each player's duties on every play, and in the elimination of wasted movement and energy. For years an advocate of the single wing back and unbalanced line formations largely for those reasons, he has lately come over to the use of the "T" in some combinations and variations.

Finch has an able lieutenant in Line Coach Lawrence "Doc" Sweeney. After four years of prep school coaching at St. Joseph and Saginaw high schools, Doc took over the line coaching duties at Central Michigan with great success. In the seven years Doc has been tutoring Chippewa linesmen, Central has had some of the greatest forward walls in the school's football history. Two of Doc's proteges have won Little All-America recognition.

New to the Chippewa staff this fall is Lyle Bennett, who is working with the ends and kickers and will have charge of the "B" squad. Bennett is also head track coach. With 15 years of prep school coaching experience and four years with college teams at Alma College and University of Michigan, Lyle is a very considerable asset to the Chippewa staff.

## About the Battling Bishops

COACH GEORGE E. GAUTHIER is starting out his 26th "Battling Bishop" team against Central Michigan. A native of the State of Michigan, Gauthier is returning with a veteran Ohio Wesleyan team. Some of the outstanding victories of Gauthier's football teams have been over the University of Michigan, Syracuse, Detroit, and Michigan State. In 1922 Ohio State was held to a 5-0 score and in 1925 to a 10-3 score. Since Gauthier's arrival on the Ohio Wesleyan athletic front, his teams have won 116 games, lost 92 and tied 14.

BOB BRENTLINGER is a three-sport letterman at Ohio Wesleyan. He will start at quarter-back. Back in 1942, "Brent" was one of Ohio Wesleyan's leading ground-gainers. He served three years in the air corps and is now back as a senior to windup his outstanding college sports career. In addition to winning all kinds of athletic laurels at Ohio Wesleyan, he excels at studying, too.

MERLE LASHEY, sophomore, has won the fullback berth on the "Battling Bishop" team. Lashey, from Marion, Ohio, is getting his first taste of intercollegiate football but has shown up well in practice — so well that Coach Gauthier moved him up to first string full back.

JIM DIAMOND was first string center in 1942. He played fullback in high school at Geneva, Ohio but switched when he came to Ohio Wesleyan. He spent three years in the air corps.
