





Leo Wisneski Kenneth "Bill" Kelly Alfred Thomas


Beginning his sixth season as head football coach, Kenneth "Bill" Kelly will be looking for his fifth IIAC Championship. In five years at Central his grid teams have won 35, lost 9 and tied one. He is also head mentor of the Chippewa tennis squad.

He graduated from Mt. Pleasant High School and from Central Michigan College in 1930, where he won 13 varsity letters. In 21 years of prep school coaching at Cass City, Mt. Pleasant, and Saginaw Arthur Hill Kelly's football teams won 128 games, lost 47 and tied 8. Kelly is married and has two daughters.

Alfred "Al" Thomas, backfield coach, is beginning his eighth year at Central Michigan. He coached at Ishpeming High School for a year and served two years as a backfield and head track coach at William and Mary. He graduated from the University of Michigan in 1942 and was named to the All-American track team that year. A leg in jury hampered his football activities at Michigan during his sophomore and junior years, but he was considered one of their finest backs as a senior. Al is also assistant track coach at Central. The Thomases have two daughters.

Line Coach, Leo Wisneski, was one of Central Michigan's all-time athletic greats. He joined the Chippewa staff in 1954 after coaching at Mt. Pleasant and Bay City Central High Schools. Leo received Little All-American honors as a half-back in 1941 and also was a standout in basketball and baseball. He is head coach of Central's golf and swimming squads also. Wisneski is married and has a daughter and a son.

TODAY'S GAME Milwaukee State vs. Central Michigan

Today Milwaukee State will attempt to play the part of a giant-killer as the team tackles the Central Michigan Chippewas.

This is the fifth meeting of the two football teams, Milwaukee having won the first game in 1947 by a 12-0 score, but dropping the games since then by top-heavy scores. In 1948 the Chips won 21-6, and then after a lapse when the two schools did not play Central came back with a 26-7 victory in 1954 and a 63-12 triumph last year in Milwaukee.


Right now the Milwaukee team in the midst of a dismal year. They opened the season losing to Macalester 0-18, then they dropped a 13-27 decision to Whitewater State. Milwaukee lost again, this time to Oshkosh State by 13-20. They followed with two close games, but the opponents were victorious, Eau Claire State winning 20-15 and Central State trimming Milwaukee by 7-6. Last week Milwaukee played Platteville State.

Last year Milwaukee got off to a better start, winning two of their first three games, only to drop the last five in a row.


Armin Kraeft is head coach at Milwaukee and is assisted by John Tierney and Bill Ritter. The athletic director is Herman Kluge. The athletic teams are members of the Wisconsin State College Conference.

Only this year Wisconsin State College of Milwaukee was merged with University of Wisconsin - Milwaukee to form the school. The enrollment is about 5,000.

While Milwaukee has been losing, Central Michigan has been winning. The Chips squeezed by Bradley 38-33, trimmed Western Michigan 14-7, clobbered Southern Illinois 32-13, swamped Northern Illinois 41-0, and ruined Western Illinois' homecoming with a 44-20 win. Last week was homecoming at Central as Central beat Illinois Normal, 20-0.


