Lettermen Returning/Lost: 30/26 Starters Returning/Lost: 9/15 Central Michigan University's football team is young and inexperienced, but don't tell head coach Dick Flynn that his Chippewas won't be competitive in 1995. He believes otherwise.

"Our goal is to successfully defend the conference championship," said Flynn. "I think we can be an awfully good football team. It's just a matter of how quickly we mature."

The Chippewas did lose 26 lettermen

and 15 starters from last year's Mid-American Conference championship team, including All-American tailback Brian Pruitt and all-MAC standouts Matt Nastally, Jerremy Dunlap and Chris O'Brien.

"We lost some great football players," said Flynn, the MAC's "Coach of the Year" in '94. "In fact, I can't remember losing 26 lettermen ...all of whom were major contributors to our success.

"But, we have some talented young players who saw what type of effort it takes to be successful and win a championship. I'm looking forward to this season."

A total of 30 lettermen return from a team that went 9-3 for the season and won the MAC title with an 8-1 record.

Leading the list of returnees is first team all-MAC safety Quincy Wright, a hard-hitting junior free safety who led the Chippewas in tackles in 1994 with 112. He's a 6-1, 190-pounder.

Wright is joined on defense by four other returning starters—junior outside linebackers Greg Spranger (6-3, 220 pounds) and Bubba Hester (6-0, 230), junior inside linebacker Cory Gildersleeve (6-2, 230) and senior strong safety Chad Murphy (6-1, 190).

The offensive side of the ball returns five men who were starters in three positions, all on the line. Junior Scott Rehberg (6-8, 320) and sophomore Gary Glowacki (6-4, 290) shared one tackle spot last season (Rehberg missed eight games with an injury) and will man both this year. Senior Bryan Carpenter (6-3, 290) is back at left guard while Brock Gutierrez (6-4, 290) and Jim Kozlowski (6-2, 280) shared the center job (Gutierrez was sidelined six games with an injury).

The only other returning starter is senior placekicker Brad Blasy who was second on the team in scoring a year

ago with 64 points. He hit 40-of-42 extra points and eight-of-12 field goals.

For the second straight season one of the biggest question marks surrounding the Chippewas is the man behind center. Erik Timpf made the most of his only year as CMU's starting quarterback. This year, it will be

"All indications are that Chad is ready to step in and do the job," said Flynn. "He had an excellent spring. When

junior Chad Darnell's turn.

do the job," said Flynn. "He had an excellent spring. When he did play last season, he played well. He showed he was ready."

Sophomore Tim Crowley will serve as Darnell's backup.

The Chippewas will be equally as inexperienced at tailback after losing Pruitt (1,890 yards) and Eric Johnson (405). Senior Damon Tolbert (106) is the only back with experience although redshirt freshmen Chad Alexander and Silas Massey III are talented prospects who will get plenty of opportunities.

"I don't see us with one back gaining a lot of yards," said Flynn. "We're confident those three can more than handle the job."

Senior Chad Frazier and junior Chris Parmele are ready to step in at fullback for John King while senior Derek van der Merwe (6-3, 280) has moved into the opening on the offensive line at guard.


CMU isn't as fortunate at tight end or wide receiver—there are no experienced replacements waiting their turn.

Redshirt freshman Adam Simonson (6-5, 235) and junior Steve Kelly (6-2, 235) will share the tight end slot, Kelly having finished the '94 season as the No. 2 man.

Central lost its top two receivers at split end and swingback, including leading receiver Terrance McMillan (29 catches for 398 yards and three TDs). Walk-on freshman Bryan Schorman and sophomore Adam Kerr will be at split end. Senior Grant Elmquist, who doubles as the punt returner, and redshirt freshman Reggie Allen (a converted cornerback) will handle the swingback role.

The biggest concern on defense is from tackle-to-tackle where the Chippewas lost its three starters...tackles Dustin Preston and Chris List and middle guard Chad Preston.

Senior Mitch Panchula (6-3, 275) and sophomore Travis Allen (6-4, 260)

emerged from spring ball as the tackles with sophomore Steve Black (6-4, 230) and redshirt freshman C.J. Remmo (6-5, 250) as backups. Senior Carl Barth (6-4, 300) and redshirt frosh Calvin Massenberg (6-0, 270), a converted fullback, will be at middle guard.


"There's no question that the play of our wide receivers and defensive line will be critical to our success," said Flynn.

CMU will also be young at cornerback where sophomore Jason Husband and redshirt freshman Shawn Williams are ticketed for starting roles. The experienced play at safety of Murphy and Wright will help here.

Linebacking will be solid and deep for Central.

Joining Gildersleeve as a starter at inside linebacker will be 6-2, 225-pound Charlie Bush with veteran juniors Shawn Alpers (6-0, 220) and Shawn Deer (5-11, 225) as able reserves. Spranger, backed by junior Desmond Schultz (5-10, 230), will man one outside linebacker position while senior Nate Simington (6-2, 230) is pushing Hester for the other side.

Punter Craig Fischer, the "fleetfooted" hero of the championship game at Bowling Green, is gone. Senior Alex Kemp will get a shot along with junior college transfer Ben Kroft.



First team all-MAC returnee Quincy Wright (10) is looking for better things in his junior season. The hard-hitting free safety led CMU in tackles last season with 112. He also had three fumble recoveries and two interceptions.

Long snapper is also a concern with four-year regular Robert Hadacz graduating. Redshirt freshman Judd Seida and Spranger are the best bets.

Chippewa Strengths

Flynn points to three main strengths of the 1995 team:

- 1. offensive line
- 2. linebacking
- 3. safeties

The Chippewas had two all-MAC selections on the offensive front last season in Chris O'Brien and Matt Nastally and could have a couple more from the starting unit of Scott Rehberg and Gary Glowacki at tackle, Bryan Carpenter and Derek van der Merwe at guard and Brock Gutierrez at center.

Three of four starters return at the inside and outside linebacking positions—Greg Spranger and Bubba Hester at OLB and Cory Gildersleeve at ILB. Both positions have proven depth (Nate

Simington and Desmond Schultz at outside, Charlie Bush, Shawn Alpers and Shawn Deer at inside).


Flynn will put his safety duo of senior Chad Murphy and all-MAC junior Quincy Wright up against any in the conference.

Chippewa Concerns

Flynn sees four areas of concern for his 1995 football team:

- 1. wide receiver
- 2. defensive line
- 3. tight end
- 4. tailback

Senior Grant Elmquist is the only wide receiver to have ever caught a collegiate pass—he

snared a six-yard TD pass last season from Chad Darnell. Elmquist came out of spring ball as the No. 1 swingback while walk-on redshirt freshman Bryan Schorman is the starting split end. Their backups are redshirt freshman Reggie Allen and sophomore Adam Kerr, respectively.

Seniors Carl Barth and Mitch
Panchula are the only players with much
experience on the defensive line. After
that, the Chippewas will look to sophomore Travis Allen and redshirt freshmen
C.J. Remmo and Calvin Massenberg.

Redshirt freshman Adam Simonson and junior Steve Kelly are the tight ends. Kelly saw considerable action late in the '94 season.

Flynn isn't nearly as worried about the tailback situation as some may be. He thinks the trio of senior Damon Tolbert and redshirt freshmen Silas Massey and Chad Alexander can get the job done.

Chippewas by Position OFFENSE


Quarterback—Junior Chad Darnell completed all five passes he threw during the regular season, hitting five-of-

five for 60 yards and one TD. He also saw extensive action in the Las Vegas Bowl, completing six-of-13 for 102 yards and one score. Sophomore Tim Crowley and freshman Tony Lorenzatti will battle for time.

Tailback—Damon Tolbert is the smallest player on the team at 5-7, 175 pounds, but he also may have the biggest heart. He gained 106 yards in 22 carries and scored once during the '94 campaign. Tolbert was Central's leading rusher in the Las Vegas Bowl with 11 carries for 79 yards and another TD. Redshirt freshmen Chad Alexander and Silas Massey will share the job with Tolbert.

Fullback—Senior Chad Frazier and junior Chris Parmele provide a veteran one-two punch at this position. Frazier carried nine times for 31 yards a year ago while Parmele had two carries for three yards. Both saw action on special teams. Redshirt freshman Jeff Angeli will work at No. 3.

Swingback—Senior Grant Elmquist is No. 1 here after handling much of the punt return duties the past three seasons. He caught one pass for a six-yard TD from Darnell during the '94 season. Converted cornerback Reggie Allen, a

redshirt freshman, will be behind Elmquist.

Split End—Redshirt freshman walk-on Bryan Schorman won this job in the spring, but he'll be pushed by sophomore Adam Kerr who saw limited action a year ago.

Tight End—Redshirt freshman Adam Simonson and junior Steve Kelly will share this important job. Both will see playing time in two TE situations while senior Mike Grimes will provide depth.

Tackle—Big and talented is the best way to describe the Chippewa tackles. Junior Scott Rehberg (6-8, 320 pounds) anchors the left side while sophomore Gary Glowacki (6-4, 290) is at right tackle. A pair of promising redshirt freshmen will back them up in 6-6, 265-pound Kevin Bahr and 6-5, 250-pound Doug Bontekoe.

Guard—Senior Bryan Carpenter (6-3, 290) returns for his second season as a starter at left guard while senior Derek van der Merwe (6-3, 280) emerged from spring ball as the No. 1 man on the right

side. Sophomores Andre Walker (6-3, 280) and Rollie Ferris (6-3, 290) will provide quality depth.

Center—Senior Brock Gutierrez (6-4, 290) bolsters the middle of the line, and he'll be backed by versatile junior Jim Kozlowski (6-2, 280) who also could play guard. Redshirt freshman Mike Cipa (6-4, 265) is the center of the future.

Placekicker—Senior Brad Blasy returns at this important position. He hit on 40-of-42 extra points and eight-of-12 field goals last season. Sophomore Dominic Migaldi will be the backup after hitting all four extra points a year ago.

DEFENSE

Outside Linebacker—This position is one of the strengths





on this year's team, both in quality and quantity. The Chippewas return four veterans including starting juniors Greg Spranger and Bubba Hester. Senior Nate Simington, an excellent pass rusher, will battle Hester for the top job while junior Desmond Schultz will operate behind Spranger.

Tackle—Senior Mitch Panchula (6-3, 275) and sophomore Travis Allen (6-4, 260) are the starters here, and they're the only two with experience at this spot. Panchula was in on 12 tackles last fall, Allen in on two although one was a QB sack for a loss of 12 yards. Sophomore Steve Black (6-4, 230) and redshirt freshman C.J. Remmo (6-5, 250) are three backups.

Middle Guard—Senior Carl Barth (6-4, 300) had six tackles a year ago at this spot and earned the starting job in the spring. Look for redshirt freshman Calvin Massenberg (6-0, 270) to get his time, though.

Inside Linebacker—Junior Cory
Gildersleeve (6-2, 230) and sophomore
Charlie Bush (6-2, 225) combine size
and savvy to make this a solid position.
Gildersleeve was fifth in tackles a year
ago as a starter with 59 stops while Bush
was in on 22. Juniors Shawn Alpers (6-0,

220) and Shawn Deer (5-11, 225) provide experience and depth.

Cornerback—The Chippewas will be inexperienced at these two spots, but coaches like what they see in sophomore Jason Husband and redshirt freshman Shawn Williams. Both have size and speed although Husband was the only one to play a year ago in a reserve capacity. Redshirt freshman Will Lewis, a converted tailback, and walk-on sophomore Abjuahn Clark are the backups.

Safety—Senior Chad Murphy and all-MAC junior Quincy Wright make this one of the team's strongest positions. Murphy battled the injury bug and had only 27 tackles and one interception while Wright led the team in tackles with 112 and picked off two errant passes. Junior John Blackstock and sophomore Daryl Montie are experienced reserves.

Punter—The Chippewas have no experience at this position although senior Alex Kemp had a solid spring and is No. 1. Junior college transfer Ben Kroft will get a chance to unseat Kemp when drills open in August.

The Schedule and the MAC

Demanding and unusual is the best way to describe the 1995 football schedule for Central Michigan.

"Last year was ideal," said CMU coach Dick Flynn. "We rotated on the road and then at home all season. This year is much more demanding.

"We play games on the road and at home in bunches. It should prove interesting and challenging. Our non-conference schedule is awfully tough when you look at road games with East Carolina and Youngstown State—both outstanding teams which were in bowls last year."

Youngstown State has won the last two NCAA Division II championships while East

Carolina played in the Liberty Bowl last season. The Chippewas' other nonleague foe, Weber State, has been a solid Division IAA team.

CMU goes on the road in the middle of the season for three straight night games with Akron, Eastern Michigan and Youngstown State before returning home for three straight home encounters with Kent, Miami and Toledo. The Chippewas then close on the road at Ball State and Western Michigan.

With regard to the MAC, Flynn points to Bowling Green as the team to beat although Miami, Toledo and Western Michigan are right behind.

"It should be tremendously competitive," he said. "Bowling Green, Western and Toledo all return outstanding quarterbacks which could give them an edge. Ball State and Eastern Michigan will be talented. It just depends on how quickly they adapt to new coaches."



HEAD COACH DICK FLYNN



For an encore...
it's going to be a little
tough for Dick Flynn.

The second-year Central Michigan University football coach did it all in his "rookie" season as the head man with the Chippewas.

His team won the Mid-American Conference (MAC) championship outright, played in Las Vegas Bowl III, and he was named MAC "Coach of the Year."

"It was an incredible year," said Flynn, who was born on July 17, 1943. "I was most happy for our seniors. They suffered through two straight 5-6 seasons but came together and did something special."

The Chippewas won their second MAC title of the 1990s, rolling to an 8-1 record and an overall mark of 9-3.

The 52-year-old Flynn became Central Michigan's 22nd head coach on April 25, 1994, replacing 16-year veteran Herb Deromedi who remains his boss as CMU's athletic director.

Flynn was the first hire of Deromedi in 1978 when he became the Chippewa mentor, and Flynn excelled as the defensive coordinator ever since.

CMU led the Mid-American Conference (MAC) in total defense on three occasions under Flynn while pacing the MAC in rushing defense six times and

scoring defense seven times.

Central's 1990 team led the nation in scoring defense, giving up just 8.9 points per game, and won the MAC title.

"I recognize the responsibility and expectations that go with being head coach at Central Michigan," said Flynn. "The expectations here are great."

Following a splendid prep career at Mount Pleasant High (graduated in 1961) where he was all-state in football as a fullback and linebacker, Flynn narrowed his choice of colleges to Michigan and Michigan State.

He chose MSU and played in 1962 and '63 as a reserve end. As a senior, Flynn was a starting offensive tackle despite being only 6-2 and 190 pounds. He played the most minutes of anyone on the team and was the

recipient of the Potsy Ross Award as the outstanding senior scholar athlete.

Flynn earned his teaching certificate from Michigan State in 1965 and began his coaching career at Lansing Eastern High School as an assistant coach in football and baseball.

In the fall of 1966, Dick went into the Air Force where he spent the next four years in radar bases in Pennsylvania and Kansas. He reached the rank of captain before finishing his duty in 1970.

Flynn returned to Lansing Eastern and was assistant coach in football and basketball in 1970-71. He became the head coach in both sports the following year. Beginning in 1972, he served only as the football coach. His seven Eastern teams were 37-23, and he was named the Lansing area "Coach of the Year" in 1975.

As Central's defensive commander, Flynn's squads were known for their quick, hard-hitting and aggressive character.




(1982) and all-MAC selections Rich Curtiss (1990), Chris Wise (1987), Mike Bevier (1984) and Tim Hollingsworth (1979).

Flynn and his wife, Mary, reside in Mount Pleasant and have two daughters, Kelly (22) and Katie (20). Mary is an elementary physical education teacher in the Mount Pleasant school system. Kelly is a recent graduate of Michigan State in elementary education, and Katie is a junior at Grand Valley State University where she is an all-American swimmer.

Q What about your storybook first year as CMU's head coach?

A It was like something out of a Hollywood script the way everything came together. We won so many close games that it had almost an unreal aura to it. But, it was great for the seniors and reflected the type of leadership they gave us throughout the year.

Q It must have been a tremendously pleasing season.

A It was great for everyone connected with our program. It was an exciting time. There was the excitement of the change in head coach, and then to have the success we had was the frosting on the cake. It reinforced a lot of things we believe in at Central, and I was really happy for the staff who had put in so much hard work to make the season a success.

Q Any one memory in particular from last season?

A No, not really. So many things happened. If you were a fan of ours, you probably had that one favorite game or moment. There were too many for me to pick one.

Q What was the biggest change for you going from an assistant to head coach?

A The totality of the job was the biggest difference. As an assistant, you're responsible for a small group of individuals. As a head coach, you're responsible for the entire team. It's a much broader responsibility that deals with so many other areas other than just the strategy of the game.

Q What benefits did CMU reap from winning the MAC title?

A It was a tremendous plus for us. When you are able to go through a coaching change and are able to win, it legitimizes your program to recruits and shows that we're going to carry on the great tradition that Central Michigan has.

Q What about the Las Vegas Bowl experience?

A It was a great experience for our team and fans. There were so many great events connected with the football game. Our team was excited all the time it was out there. The negative part was the game itself. We just didn't play to our capabilities. Overall, it was a positive experience for all concerned.

Q What was it like to coach Brian Pruitt in your first year?

A You really must give the credit to coach Tom Kearly. He was Brian's position coach. We just feel fortunate to have had as talented an individual as Brian on the football team, not just for what he did on the field but for the example he set off the field.

Q Describe yourself as a football coach.

A No. 1, I think I'm a good teacher. I know what I want and believe I can get it across to my players. I think I have the ability to do a good job of preparing and motivating a team to play at its best level.

Q Can athletics and academics go hand-in-hand?

A It's an extremely important part of the equation. It should be the very essence of why every player is here at Central...he wants his degree. It's our job to foster that and to help in every way to achieve his degree. As our graduation rate indicates, we have been able to achieve that goal.

Q What do you look for in a recruit?

A First of all, he must have the ability to play at a Division I level. From there, you look for people with the highest character level and those who love to play the game and to whom an education is important.

Q Will Central continue to spend the majority of its time recruiting in Michigan?

Our emphasis will still be on the high school players in Michigan. We intend to carry on that part of the tradition that is CMU football. We know they're well-prepared by the coaches in this

Q What does CMU and Mount Pleasant have to offer a prospective recruit?

A First of all, a great education. And, a great education in a setting that's

enthused and excited about what's going on. The support we have is great from an athletic standpoint. It's a fun place to be. There's an atmosphere on campus—the way the people interact with the town and the professors and the students-that makes this a pleasant place

Q How important is it for the MAC champion to go to a bowl?

A It's extremely important. It's a little extra incentive and an award for a job well done. All of us like to have that challenge, that one extra opportunity, to play somebody who has had success. Plus, it's a tremendous occasion for the university to rally around and gives us nationwide exposure.

Q How about remaining Division I?

A I think we can stay Division I, and I think it's important that we do. It gives us a chance to play teams we wouldn't get the opportunity to like Michigan State and Iowa. It gives us the chance to play the best and be the best. It's a commitment to excellence. Division I status carries throughout the whole school and helps the way that school feels about itself and is regarded by others.

Q What's your offensive philosophy?

A Balanced. It's important that we have the ability to run the football. There's no getting around it. It's probably the most critical element, especially in this part of the country with the weather we have. Even great passing teams must be able to run.

Q What's your defensive philosophy?

A We want to play an aggressive, attacking style on defense. We want to be physical and sound on principles. We must have the ability to put pressure on the offense to keep it out of rhythm.

COACHES' BIOGRAPHIES



Assistant Head Coach/Offensive Coordinator

In 11 seasons as a Chippewa assistant, Tom Kearly has known success on both

sides of the line of scrimmage. Kearly is in his second season as assistant head coach and his fourth as offensive coordinator.

The Chippewas led the MAC in rushing during the 1994 season, averaging 284.7 yards per game. CMU also was ninth in the nation and second in the MAC in scoring offense (34.2) and third in the MAC in total offense (407.7).

The Hancock, Mich., native spent his first four years on the CMU staff developing outside linebackers, while overseeing the offensive backfield for the last six seasons. He has developed all-MAC performers on offense and defense. including All-American Brian Pruitt in 1994, tailback Billy Smith in 1990-91, and MAC "Player of the Year" guarterback Jeff Bender in 1990. Defensively, he coached the likes of Kevin Egnatuk and Steve Sklenar, both of whom were academic All-Americans.

An honorable mention all-league quarterback and 1979 grad of Winona State (Minn.), Kearly lists the 1994 season, the title-clinching game at Ohio in 1990, and the two wins at Michigan State as his top moments at CMU. But, Kearly enjoys every autumn Saturday.

"Football is important at CMU. I love Saturdays in the fall because you can feel the excitement," he said.

Defensive Coordinator

Veteran assistant Jim Schulte enters his second season as defensive coordinator in 1995. Schulte replaced head coach Dick

Flynn as the No. 1 man on the defensive coaching staff in 1994 while retaining his defensive line coaching chores.

A former Chippewa linebacker and graduate assistant, Schulte enters his 18th season as defensive line coach and 19th as a full-time coach.

Schulte was a standout player for Central, setting a single-season record for tackles with 151 in 1973. That standard stood for nearly a decade until former Chippewa Ray Bentley recorded 173 in 1982.

After graduating in his record-setting year, Schulte taught at Suttons Bay Area High School and was an assistant coach at Ludington High School before returning to his alma mater to do graduate work in 1975-76. In 1977, Schulte coached the outside linebackers before taking over the defensive line the following season.

Schulte has turned out ten first team and five second team all-league performers. He fondly recalls his first defensive line (1978) of tackles Bill White and Chuck Stiver and nose guard Dave Maine. In 1983, Central claimed both defensive tackle spots on the all-MAC squad with Mike Mills and Pat Brackett gaining the recognition. In addition, J.J. Wierenga (1989 and 1990) and Mike Nettie (1991 and 1992) were back-toback first team picks.

Long-time Chippewa assistant coach Denny LaFleur is in his second year of coaching CMU's outside linebackers.

LaFleur has experienced the full gamut of Chippewa football-from his playing days highlighted by the 1974 National Championship through involvement as a graduate assistant and then as an assistant coach for over a decade.


In 1993, under LaFleur's tutelage. CMU was second in the MAC in passing defense—allowing only 157.3 yards a game and a MAC-low six TDs.

This year marks LaFleur's 20th season as a CMU coach, including 16 as a full-time assistant. The 42-year-old native of Flushing has overseen the development of seven first team and eight second team all-conference defensive backs including Robert Jackson (former NFL Cincinnati Bengal) and Jim Bowman (former NFL New England Patriot). The 1991 unit boasted a pair of all-MAC performers in two-time pick David Johnson and first-time selection Ken Strong.

LaFleur was hired as a graduate assistant in 1976 and coached the defensive ends for a brief period before taking charge of the secondary. His 324 career hits rank sixth on the CMU all-time list.



Cummings then spent two seasons with Millersville University in Pennsylvania as the offensive line coach before returning to Mount Pleasant.



Starnes, 39, is in charge of setting up physical programs for the development of CMU athletes.



1994: IT WAS A SEASON TO REMEMBER

Senior leadership plus dedication equals victories.

That's the formula Central Michigan University used en route to the 1994 Mid-American Conference (MAC) football championship and a berth in the Dec. 15 conversion and the win, but senior Las Vegas Bowl III.

A group of 21 seniors, frustrated by the first two losing seasons in 28 years of Chippewa football, dedicated themselves to the '94 campaign.

"We asked for more, and more was given," said first-year head coach Dick Flynn.

"It was evident that our players were doing more than just talking about this season...they were preparing themselves for a great year. The seniors led the way."

And great leaders they proved to be. The Chippewas claimed their first MAC title since 1990 in thrilling fashion, posting a 36-33 win at Bowling Green State University on the final day of the regular season in a winner-take-all matchup. CMU finished the regular season with a 9-2 record—its most wins since the 1980 club went 9-2-and won the conference crown with an 8-1 slate.

It's hard to believe that a regular season ending on such an upbeat note got off to such a humble beginning. CMU fell at Iowa, 52-21, on Labor Day weekend.

"We lost to a healthy and pretty good Iowa football team," said Flynn, CMU's defensive coordinator for the previous 16 vears under current athletic director Herb Deromedi. "What I liked most was the way our players reacted. They didn't like what had happened. They were upset with themselves.'

Little did Flynn and Central Michigan fans know that the Chippewas would lose only one more game all season—a 31-28 verdict in game No. 5 at Ball State.

The first victim of the "I'll Show You" attitude was UNLV. CMU rushed for a school-record 551 yards, including 274 yards by senior Brian Pruitt, and posted a 35-23 victory. The two teams combined for 1,051 yards, 595 by the Chippewas.

Flynn always goes back to Game No. 3 at Eastern Michigan when people ask when he thought he may have something 1 on a sunny day in Muncie, the Chippespecial in this team.

Central Michigan battled a fired-up Eastern Michigan club the whole way, only to have the Eagles score in the final minute to cut the Chippewa lead to 30-29. EMU opted to go for the two-point cornerback Tim Banks leaped high to bat the pass away.

"It was the first of many key plays that we made throughout the season when we had to," said Flynn. "Some people would later call us a team of destiny, and that's fine. I would prefer to say that we were a team that made the big play when we had to."

Central upped its record to 3-1 with a

lopsided win over Kent, 45-0, before stumbling at Ball State the following week, 31-28.

"A lot of people may have written us off after that loss, but I liked the savvy and fight we showed to come back," said Flynn. "Our players were again upset with themselves and went back to work with renewed effort."

From that three-point setback on Oct.

was would not lose again. They overcame tremendous odds along the way.

Picked to finish fifth by the MAC News Media Association in the annual preseason poll, CMU still had three of the four teams selected ahead of it on the schedule-favorite Western Michigan, always-strong Toledo and the pick to finish second, Bowling Green.

"Big Mo" jumped on the Chippewa bandwagon the following week when an overflow crowd of 28,265 in Kelly/Shorts Stadium watched Central win a 35-28 thriller over arch-rival Western Michigan.

CMU had little trouble in their next game, racing to a 47-0 win at Akron to push its record to 5-2.

When you think of important dates during the '94 season, though, put a red circle around Oct. 22. Not only did the Chippewas defeat a good Miami team in near-unbelievable fashion, but it was the day Central took control of its own

It was the day when "all" CMU had to do was run the table and win the remainder of the games to guarantee a MAC crown. When Bowling Green drubbed Ball State, 59-36, the Chippewas moved ahead of the only team they had lost to in conference play.

It was also the day of the second big play of the 1994 season.

In an exciting, offensive game, Miami scored with 53 seconds to play to grab a 30-26 lead before a hushed Homecoming crowd in Kelly/Shorts Stadium.

Moments later, though, senior quarterback Erik Timpf masterminded one of the great drives in Chippewa

Timpf took CMU 80 yards in eight plays, hitting a leaping junior Terrance McMillan in the end zone from 19 yards out with no time remaining on the clock. Within seconds, the field was flooded with delirious Chippewa followers and Central never even attempted the extra point.

"It was amazing how confident the offense was before the drive," recalled Flynn. "They were going to go and get the job done. There were only three seconds used when the ball wasn't in play. They executed as well as posEntering the final two weeks of the season, there were only three teams remaining with a chance to win the MAC title—league-leading Bowling Green, Central and Toledo.

The Chippewas put an end to the Rocket hopes on a rainy, overcast day in Mount Pleasant. Better stated, Brian Pruitt eliminated Toledo.

In the greatest single rushing day in Central Michigan and Mid-American Conference history, the Chippewas posted a 45-27 win. Pruitt rushed for 356 yards and five TDs on 39 carries, setting 10 records and tying an additional three.

Pruitt also drew national notoriety by becoming the country's leading rusher for one week with an average of 174.9 yards a game.

But Pruitt and his teammates had other things on their minds. The stage was set and it was Show Time.

Central Michigan vs. Bowling Green. Winner take all.

"How could you ask for anything more?" Flynn said. "Two football teams playing 60 minutes in the final game of the season for the championship."

In a season of big plays and memorable moments, the biggest and most memorable was yet to come. In fact, it will likely go down in Chippewa gridiron lore as "The Play."

No, it wasn't the 70-yard run for a TD by Pruitt or the 31-yard interception return for a score by senior Brandon Bruce. It wasn't even CMU's version of the "Immaculate Reception" when Pruitt made a diving catch of an end zone pass that ricochetted off McMillan.

Senior punter Craig Fischer was the unlikely hero.

With Central trailing 25-21 in the fourth period, the Chippewas were forced to punt from their own 27. Fischer had other ideas.

After watching the Bowling Green players peel off the line of scrimmage and head back down field to set up a return, Fischer figured he could easily run the three yards for a first down before the Falcons would recover.

Three yards turned into 73 and a touchdown as the 6-3, 230-pounder raced untouched into the end zone.

"It was a great play by Craig," said Flynn. "I was as surprised as anybody and just started yelling 'Go, Go.' He's a smart young man and noticed something on film and during the game."

Believe it or not, Fischer's run was the longest from scrimmage in Division IA college football on that day, earning him the AT&T Long Distance Award.

When you win championships, heroes abound. The Chippewas are no exception.

Pruitt set school and MAC rushing marks of 1,890 yards. The 5-10, 205-pounder outgained five MAC teams.

"Not only is Brian an excellent football player, but he's a quality person," said Flynn. "He's a genuine person who does a lot of good for the young kids in our area."

Pruitt was always the first one to give credit to his blockers, headed by senior linemen Matt Nastally and Chris O'Brien, senior tight end Jerremy Dunlap and senior fullback John King.

If it weren't for Pruitt, the Chippewa MVP might have been Timpf who waited four years before getting his shot as a fifth-year senior. Erik threw for 1,315 yards and rushed for 463 more.

Fate dealt the Chippewas a cruel blow less than a week before Las Vegas Bowl III. In a non-contact drill, Pruitt sustained a severe knee bruise when he was accidentally hit. Despite hours of ice and rehab, CMU's All-American could do little more than watch and cheer from the sidelines in CMU's 52-24 loss.

It was a disappointing finish to a tremendous season...one which will long be remembered for a MAC championship and a 9-3 record.

UNLV 52, CMU 24

Dec. 15, Las Vegas, Nevada

In their second meeting of the season, the Chippewas faced the Rebels in Las Vegas Bowl III. The game was Central's second-ever NCAA Division I bowl game.

UNLV jumped out to an early 14-0 lead as the Rebels scored on their first two possessions. Without All-American Brian Pruitt, sidelined with a bruised knee, the Chippewa offense struggled.

A Brad Blasy 20-yard field goal put Central on the scoreboard with 3:44 left in the first quarter. Then, on the last play of the first quarter, Erik Timpf hit Terrance McMillan with a 53-yard touchdown pass giving UNLV only a 14-10 lead.

The second quarter belonged to UNLV as three CMU turnovers resulted in 17 more points for the Rebels, giving UNLV a 31-10 lead going into halftime.

It didn't get any better for the Chippewas in the third quarter as UNLV shutout the CMU offense again.

UNLV continued its stampede into the fourth quarter by scoring on its first possession, expanding the lead to 52-10. Central managed to get on the scoreboard again with 8:10 remaining in the game when Chad Darnell threw a 24-yard touchdown pass to Terrance McMillan. With 1:33 left in the game, Central managed to score again as Damon Tolbert ran in the end zone from four yards out.

VEGAS BOWL DIARY

LAS VEGAS BOWL ROUNDUP

It took 10 tries for Central Michigan University to reach the pinnacle of Mid-American Conference (MAC) football by playing in the California Bowl in 1990.

The Chippewas only had to wait four years to return West as conference champion for the MAC-Big West clambake in its new venue—Las Vegas.

You know...bright lights, sleepless nights, action.

When the Chippewas moved their football party from the brisk days of late fall in Michigan to the Nevada desert, they didn't come alone. Just as they had done in '90 in Fresno, they brought the biggest turnout of MAC fans in the Las Vegas Bowl's three-year history (estimates of more than 5,000).

In fact, the Riviera Hotel was a sea of Maroon and Gold as both players and fans called it home for the week.

And, quite a week it was.


If the days from clinching the MAC title in Bowling Green to the actual day of departure seem to go by quickly, the stay in the city that never sleeps was a blur.

Here's a look back:

Monday—It's no small feat to move a

football team across the country, but AD Herb Deromedi and his staff headed by Perk Weisenburger and Jay Lanctot were equal to the task.

A midday charter from nearby Tri-Cities Airport took the travel party of nearly 150 winging into Las Vegas by late afternoon. A pep band complete with a couple of Vegas showgirls met the team at the charter terminal, and a couple of the braver players joined the young ladies for an

impromptu dance.

And then it was off to the Riviera and a night of fun and relaxation.

Some walked The Strip while others took in some of the shows and others wandered through the casinos.

It was a short night of sleep, though, as the Mid-American Conference had been given an 8:30 a.m. practice time on Tuesday at the Sam Boyd Silver Bowl.

Tuesday—It was plenty chilly when the sleepy Chippewa caravan of buses and courtesy cars pulled into the stadium located in the desert about 20 minutes southeast of the hotel.

This was one of two practices at the Silver Bowl prior to Thursday's kickoff, and Coach Dick Flynn elected to keep it closed to the media for 90 minutes of concentrated practice.

A press conference was scheduled for the Riviera upon arrival back from practice, and the No. 1 question was the condition of All-American tailback Brian Pruitt's knee. He had sustained a serious bruise in practice the previous Saturday, and rumors had him listed as doubtful for the rematch with UNLV.

More than a dozen members of the CMU football team along with Flynn attended the 11 a.m. meeting as a large group of Michigan media scrambled to

do stories on the Chippewas. There were seven television stations, six newspapers and a couple of radio stations from Michigan represented along with a bevy of Vegas media.

Everyone wanted a piece of Pruitt, though, and the affable senior from Saginaw obliged each one. He was a media delight as were most members of the Central Michigan football team.

They were polite, courteous and wellspoken. And it didn't go unnoticed by the media on hand.

Pruitt told one and all that his knee was getting better, and that he would give it his best shot come Thursday.

The Chippewas were then whisked away to a Welcome Reception at the MGM Grand Theme Park where they met the Rebels up close and in person.

After a handful of introductions, UNLV won the pie-eating contest and the water balloon toss before CMU rallied for victory in the Nerf ball throw. Erik Timpf and Chad Darnell proved more accurate than the Rebel quarterbacks.

Both teams were then allowed to roam throughout the theme park, riding the rides and enjoying the scenery. There was some good-natured competition on the bumper cars where Chippewas and Rebels took turns ganging up on each

other.

With jet-lag still a factor, CMU had a relatively early curfew so much needed rest could be made up.

A wonderful kickoff luncheon followed where former Bowling Green standout Phil Villapiano was the entertaining featured speaker.

The Chippewas then made their way back to the Silver Bowl for a 4 p.m. practice. It was here that they learned how cool things get in the desert when the sun drops down below the mountains. It felt like a chilly fall evening in Michigan.

The CMU band and cheerleaders flew in on two charters and brought new vitality to the Riviera. Few radiate the spirit of Maroon and Gold as do these groups.

The Riviera was the site of a large pep rally in the early evening featuring bands, fans and players from both schools. The Chippewa band left little doubt as to who would win the "Battle of the Bands." It out-performed and out-played the Rebel band.

Central Michigan had an enormous turnout for the pep rally and many moved upstairs for a Chippewa Alumni gathering in a room at the top of the Riviera with a breathtaking view. The band and cheerleaders highlighted this event, too.

Three of Central Michigan's most successful professional athletes were on hand for the day's festivities, including Phoenix Sun star Dan Majerle. Former major league pitcher Curt Young also was there while ex-NFL linebacker Ray Bentley was on the Chippewa radio crew for the game. Everything was ready...as the saying


goes. "On with the show, this is it."

The game, though, was anti-climactic. Pruitt could not play and spent the entire game dressed in full uniform but could only cheer his teammates on.

The Chippewas needed No. 41 on the field. And, that may not have been enough as UNLV took control early and never let up en route to a convincing 52-24 victory.

CMU's fans did help set a Las Vegas Bowl attendance record of 17,562, and their spirit, class and enthusiasm were noticed and appreciated by the players and bowl officials alike.

It was a disappointing finish to an otherwise wonderful first season for head coach Dick Flynn and his Chippewa football team. But, with so many young players playing key roles on this year's team, it may not be long before Chippewa Pride goes West again.

KELLY/SHORTS STADIUM



Kelly/Shorts Stadium (capacity 20,086), the home of Central Michigan University football, opened in 1972. The stadium was dedicated on Nov. 4, 1972, as CMU defeated Illinois State, 28-21, before a Homecoming throng of nearly 17,000.

The first collegiate football game on Astroturf in Michigan was played less than 13 months after construction began on the \$2.2

Originally, the facility was named Perry Shorts Stadium in honor of R. Perry Shorts, a 1900 graduate of Central Michigan, who went on to a distinguished banking career in Saginaw and was a generous donor of CMU.

In June of 1983, the CMU Board of Trustees voted to rename

the stadium Kelly/Shorts Stadium in honor of Kenneth (Bill) Kelly, who coached the Chippewa football team to a 91-58-2 record from 1951 to 1966.

Central Michigan has replaced the original artificial surface twice, first in 1983 and then in 1993.

In 1986, a \$140,000 scoreboard complete with a full-color message center was erected at the south end of the stadium. 
Home Sweet Home





Nov. 4, 1972—CMU 28, Illinois State 21

After 14 months of anticipation, the Chippewas and 17,000 Homecoming fans dedicated the \$2 million Perry Shorts Stadium with a close win over the Redbirds behind Gary Bevington's three TD passes.

Nov. 30, 1974—CMU 20, Boise State 6

Hosting one of the NCAA's Division II quarterfinal games, CMU upset Boise State in the Chippewas' first post-season game. Sophomore Dick Dunham scored the game's first two TDs during an 81/2-minute span in the second half to boost the Chippewas.

Dec. 7, 1974—CMU 35, Louisiana Tech 14

Central made its initial trip to a bowl game a huge success by shocking defending national champion Louisiana Tech in the Pioneer Bowl at Wichita Falls, Texas. The Bulldogs' 23-game unbeaten string came to an end as CMU methodically built a 35-0 lead over the first three quarters. Running back Dick Dunham scored a pair of touchdowns.

Dec. 14, 1974— CMU 54, Delaware 14

Considered the biggest win in CMU gridiron history to date, the Chippewas claimed the school's first national championship with a resounding conquest of a highly-regarded Blue Hens team. Dick Dunham went 68

yards on the first play of the game and scored three TDs on the day. Mike Franckowiak connected on 11 of 13 passes for 186 yards as the Chippewas finished the season with 12 straight

High by a score of 20-5.

Sept. 6, 1975—CMU 34, Western Michigan 0

Before the first overflow crowd in Perry Shorts Stadium history, CMU blanked arch-rival Western for the first time in 22 years to make a successful Mid-American Conference and major college debut. Four different backs scored in the opening half en route to 360 yards rushing for the day. Western failed to complete a pass in four tries.

Oct. 29, 1977—CMU 35, Bowling Green 28

Central's first regular-season appearance on ABC-TV's regional Game of the Week was witnessed by a Homecoming crowd of 22,761. Behind 28-14 with 12 minutes to go, the

Chippewas staged a stirring comeback behind the brilliance of senior QB Ron Rummel. After running for two TDs and passing for a two-point conversion in the opening half, Rummel added a 21-yard scoring aerial to Brian Blank and the tying PAT run with 3:35 to go. Topping it off, Rummel connected with Mike Ball on a 39-yard scoring play to win it with just 23 seconds left.

Sept. 9, 1979—CMU 41, Kent 0

Herb Deromedi's debut as the Chippewas' head coach served as a fitting prelude to the future success he would enjoy. The 11-year CMU defensive assistant coach showed he could work both sides of the ball as Central's offense put 24 points on the board in the first quarter. Fullback Will Young ran for three touchdowns and future pro quarterback Gary Hogeboom threw a

TD pass to help Deromedi to his first win.

HISTORY

Nov. 10, 1979— CMU 37, Eastern 14

Coupled with Northern Illinois' upset win over Toledo, the victory clinched CMU's first MAC football title. The visiting Hurons twice took one-touchdown leads before three CMU touchdowns in the second quarter sealed it for CMU.


Nov. 15, 1980— CMU 22, Western 10

An all-time MAC record crowd of 32,159 saw the Chippewas rally from a 10-0 deficit to become the first league member in five years to repeat as the MAC football champion. Senior QB Kevin Northup took

CMU 80 yards in a time-consuming 12-play drive for his second scoring run (15 and six) of the game to clinch the verdict in the fourth quarter.

Oct. 20, 1990—CMU 13, Toledo 12

A Kelly/Shorts Stadium Homecoming throng of 20,781 was kept in suspense until the final gun as the Chippewas took sole possession of first place in the MAC with the win. Central's stingy defense was led by linebacker Rich Curtiss' 21 tackles, and a big-play offense directed by quarterback Jeff Bender provided the scoring. A 53-yard scoring strike to Ken Ealy gave CMU a 7-6 halftime lead, and a 38-yard aerial to Bob Kench in the third quarter erased a 12-7 Toledo lead. Defenses dominated the rest of the way, but CMU's win wasn't secure until UT kicker Rusty Hanna's 51-yard field goal attempt fell short and wide as time



GREAT GAMES IN CMU HISTORY

Nov. 10, 1990-CMU 52, Ohio 7

HISTORY

The Chippewas rolled to a 38-0 halftime lead in clinching their first MAC title in 10 seasons. Tailback Darnell Rush and fullback Joe Connolly each scored two of Central's seven touchdowns in the domination of the Bobcats. The Chippewas gained 584 yards in total offense while limiting Ohio to 125. Central finished tied with Toledo at 7-1 in the MAC, but earned the California Raisin Bowl berth by virtue of its 13-12 win over the Rockets earlier in the season.

Dec. 8, 1990-San Jose State 48, CMU 24

In its first-ever NCAA Division I bowl game, Central met up with Big West power San Jose State in Fresno, Calif. Quarter-back Jeff Bender teamed up with wide receiver Ken Ealy for

three touchdown passes in the contest, but the Spartans offense proved too explosive. SJSU gained 642 yards behind the 404-yard passing performance of Ralph Martini.

Sept. 14, 1991—CMU 20, Michigan State 3

In the greatest gridiron triumph in CMU history, the Chippewas stunned the 18th-ranked Spartans, controlling all facets of the game. The Chippewas outgained MSU, 346-281, led by tailback Billy Smith's 162 yards and a fierce rush that sacked MSU quarterbacks four times. Smith's high school classmate at Detroit Henry Ford, Lamar Sally, registered three of those sacks as both players

reaped MAC "Player of the Week" honors.

Central's defense set the tone on the first series when Doug Adler stuffed Tico Duckett on fourth-and-goal at the CMU one-yard line. Smith opened the scoring with a 15-yard TD run just before halftime, and the Chippewas made it 14-0 on a 57-yard pass from Jeff Bender to Ken Ealy in the third period. From there, the defense took over.

Sept. 12, 1992—CMU 24, Michigan State 20

A great moment in CMU football history occurred when the Chippewas accomplished what few people thought they could do—repeat 1991's startling victory over Michigan State. But CMU did just that. Outstanding performances on both sides of the ball helped the Chippewas stun Michigan State 24-20 for CMU's second consecutive win over the Big Ten school.

Safety Darrall Stinson paced the CMU defense with 14 tackles, including a jarring hit that forced a MSU fumble at the

Youngblood also led CMU on a crucial 69-yard drive in the second half which took 6:33 off the clock and ended with a seven-yard TD scamper by Brian Pruitt to put the game out of reach. Junior tailback Leo Griffin gained 90 of CMU's 141 rushing yards.

Nov. 12, 1994—CMU 36, Bowling Green 33

For the last game of the season, the Chippewas traveled to

Bowling Green to play in a winner-take-all game for the MAC championship and a trip to the Las Vegas Bowl. Two unusual plays helped CMU earn the victory.

The first came in the second quarter when a pass from Erik Timpf bounced off the intended receiver and into Brian Pruitt's hands for his second touchdown of the day. Then in the fourth quarter, one of the greatest plays in CMU history happened. Bowling Green had a 25-21 lead and momentum in the game as it forced CMU to a fourthand-three situation. On his own call, CMU punter Craig Fischer faked the punt and ran 73 yards for a touchdown, regaining the lead for CMU. The Chippewas



Leonard E. Plachta capped a 21-year association with Central Michigan University on Oct. 1, 1993, when he was appointed its eleventh president. He had served as interim president since January

As CMU's president, Plachta has focused on building the university's image as a quality institution for students from

throughout Michigan and beyond. He has emphasized the importance of treating students as customers and of using available resources to manage the university efficiently and effectively.

Plachta, who was dean of CMU's College of Business Administration before accepting the interim presidency, joined the university in 1972 as a professor of accounting, served as assistant dean of the college from 1977 to 1979, and became acting dean prior to his appointment as dean in 1980

Before coming to CMU. Plachta was chairman of the business administration department at Alma College from 1971 to 1972, a faculty member and department chairman at the University of Detroit from 1961 to 1970, and a visiting associate professor at Michigan State University in 1967. He had also worked as a systems analyst for Chrysler Corp. and a consultant with Arthur Andersen & Co.

A native of Detroit, Plachta earned his bachelor of science degree in accounting in 1956 and his master of business administration degree with concentrations in finance and economics in 1959, both from the University of Detroit, and his Ph.D. degree in accounting in 1964 from Michigan State University.

The Campus and Community

It grew rapidly, undergoing several name changes before becoming Central Michigan University in 1959. CMU has grown from its roots as a teacher-training institution to become a comprehensive, doctoral-degree granting state university of more than 16,000 students. CMU celebrated its centennial during the 1992-93 academic year.
- CMU's 16,000 students come from every county in Michigan and from other states and countries.
- CMU offers nine bachelor's degrees, 10 master's degrees, two specialist's degrees and two doctoral degrees. Athletic Director

Long-time Central Michigan University football coach Herb Deromedi is in his

second year as the Chippewa athletic director. He was named on June 1, 1994.

Deromedi, 56, was selected after a national search to replace Dave Keilitz, who became executive director of the American Baseball Coaches Association.

"This is a challenging time to direct a college athletic program due to the profound changes that are taking place nationally," said Russ Herron, vice president for university relations. "Herb Deromedi is committed to facing those challenges."

Deromedi's first task was to select veteran assistant and defensive coordinator Dick Flynn as the new football coach.

During his first full year as AD, the Chippewa teams showed dramatic improvement in competition against the Mid-American Conference. The women went from fifth to a tie for second in the Jacoby Trophy race while the men went from eighth to fourth in the Reese Trophy standings. The trophies are for competiton in all sports.

Twice named MAC "Coach of the Year, in 1980 and '90, Deromedi ranked 15th among all active NCAA Division I coaches in winning percentage when he assumed his new duties. He was 110-55-10 for a percentage of .657. Deromedi's 110 wins were tied for 19th best among active

Deromedi is also the winningest coach in MAC history with 110. His 90 wins in the MAC is also best in conference history.

Three CMU teams won MAC championships under Deromedi's tutelage-1979, '80 and '90. Six times the Chippewas led the conference in total offense, three times in total defense. The 1990 team led the nation in scoring defense (8.9 points per

Deromedi had been head coach since 1978 and was an assistant coach at the university since 1967. He became CMU's 16th head coach on August 7, 1978, when



All requests for press and parking passes should be directed to the sports information office, West Hall, Central Michigan University, Mount Pleasant, Mich. 48859, 48 hours prior to the game. Permission to broadcast games and events should be made at least one month in advance to the office. Rights fees will be assessed commercial stations who are not designated as official stations for any football or basketball games. Once all official outlets, primary newspaper representatives and game service personnel have been accommodated in the working press area, remaining space will be assigned on a first-come, first-served basis to working media only.

Complete statistical results will be available approximately 15 minutes after the event concludes. CMU coaches will be available for interviews no later than ten minutes after the contest concludes. Interviews with visiting and CMU athletes on the day of a game or event should be cleared with their respective SIDs.

THE MID-AMERICAN CONFERENCE















Founded in 1946, the Mid-American Conference is one of the 10 Division I-A conferences in the country, along with the Atlantic Coast, Big Ten, Big East, Big Eight, Big West, Pacific-10, Southeastern, Southwestern and Western Athletic.

MAC schools draw roughly 80 percent of their students from the states of Ohio, Michigan and Indiana, but each of the 50 states is represented at MAC schools as well as more than 100 foreign countries. Diverse academic programs are offered at the MAC institutions with literally hundreds of degree-granting programs.

Entering its 49th year in existence, the MAC consists of 10 state-supported institutions in the midwestern states of Ohio, Michigan and Indiana. The current members are the University of Akron, Ball State University, Bowling Green State University, Central Michigan University, Eastern Michigan University, Kent State University, Miami University, Ohio University, the University of Toledo and Western Michigan University. The last nine all have been members for at least 17 years. Akron joined the MAC in

Jerry Ippoliti is in his second year as conference commissioner after being named to replace Karl Benson on July 1, 1994. Rob Fournier is the associate commissioner in charge of compliance while Kevin Grothe is the assistant commissioner/ corporate development, Tom Lessig the assistant commissioner/ communications and Cathy Lambert the director of operations. John Nealon is supervisor of football officials.

The MAC was founded as a five-school conference in 1946 with Butler, Ohio, Cincinnati, Wayne State and Western Reserve

as the charter members. The current membership evolved throughout the years. Miami and Western Michigan joined shortly after the MAC was founded. Toledo, Kent and Bowling Green became members in the early 1950s; and Central Michigan, Eastern Michigan and Ball State joined in the early 1970s.

The MAC is the only Division I-A conference with its own Hall of Fame. A total of 52 individuals have been inducted into the MAC Hall of Fame in its first six years of existence, including 20 inductees with football backgrounds. Among the football honorees are former coaches Ara Parseghian (Miami), Doyt Perry (Bowling Green), Frank Lauterbur (Toledo), Bo Schembechler (Miami), John Pont (Miami) and Don Nehlen (Bowling Green); former players Chuck Ealey (Toledo), Jack Lambert (Kent), Shafer Suggs (Ball State), Ron Johnson (Eastern Michigan), Ken Kremer (Ball State), Phil Villapiano (Bowling Green) and Gary Hogeboom (Central Michigan); and Jack McLain (MAC office), who served as the supervisor of officials for

The MAC has been in the forefront of national legislation that has enhanced the academic integrity of intercollegiate athletics. Long before the NCAA adopted or discussed implementing increased academic standards, the MAC had an academic progress rule, strengthened admittance standards and qualitative grade point average requirements for its student-athletes.

The MAC sponsors 19 championships, ten in men's sports and nine in women's sports.

Las Vegas Bowl

The 15th annual post-season football battle between the Mid-American Conference and Big West Conference champions is scheduled for Thursday, Dec. 14, at 9 p.m. EST in Las Vegas,

Las Vegas Bowl IV, which will be held in UNLV's 32,000-seat Sam Boyd Silver Bowl, will be televised live to a national television audience by ESPN.

"Obviously, this is great news for the MAC and Big West," said Commissioner Jerry Ippoliti. "The Las Vegas Bowl is very important to both conferences, and we're committed to it continuing in future years."

The Las Vegas Bowl and the Rose Bowl are the only postseason bowls that annually pit the champions of two Division I-A collegiate athletic conferences against one another.

The first 11 meetings between the MAC and the Big West came in the California Raisin Bowl in Fresno, Calif. The MAC has a 6-8 record against the Big West in the previous 14 contests.
