CMU College of Medicine (CMED) is required by the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (ACCME) to ensure that only accurate, balanced, and scientifically justified recommendations occur in all accredited continuing medical education activities and that learners are protected from promotion, marketing, and commercial bias.¹

All persons in control of content, i.e., speakers and planners, must disclose any relationships (or non-relationships) with ineligible companies² at the beginning of the educational activity.

Financial relationships must be disclosed if: (a) *the relationship is financial and occurred within the last 24 months, and* (b) *the individual has the opportunity to influence the content of CME about the products or services of an ineligible company.*
