James W. Jones Memorial Scholarship

The James W. Jones Memorial Scholarship is in support of Central Michigan University undergraduate students, who are active in advocating in matters of the LGBTQ+ community. Preference will be given to students who study world languages and who have a demonstrated commitment to the advancement of the LGBTQAI+ community. A selection committee, appointed by the Director of the Office of LGBTQ Services & Gender Equity Programs, will determine the recipient of the award. Appointed annually, the selection committee will include one undergraduate student, one staff member outside of the Office of LGBTQ Services & Gender Equity Programs, and one faculty member. The director serves on the committee as a non-voting member.

The selection committee will annually award a total of \$1,000 in scholarships. The selection committee may choose to award two \$500 scholarships or one \$1,000 scholarship per year. All students are eligible to apply for the scholarship, even if they have previously been awarded.

General Eligibility Requirements

Applicants must:

- be an incoming or current student of Central Michigan University for the upcoming Fall semester
- demonstrate a commitment to LGBTQAI+ communities
- if applicable, demonstrate the successful study of a world language
- be enrolled 12 or more credits per semester
- once awarded, remain in academic good standing for the duration of the scholarship for this scholarship, academic good standing means completing 12 or more credits per semester and maintaining a 2.5 gpa or higher
- be willing to be publicly acknowledged as a recipient of the award
