The speaker presents the Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, Accessibility and Belonging (DEIBA) Framework, focusing on ten priority areas to enhance institutional culture and climate as it relates to health equity: 1) Institutional Structure, 2) Policies and Procedures, 3) Resource Allocation, 4) Health Equity and Employee Success, 5) Curriculum and Pedagogy, 6) Hiring, Retention, and Promotion, 7) Institutional Programming, 8) Education/Training/Employee Development, 9) Access and Onboarding Practices, and 10) Fostering Inclusive Environments. The framework is adaptable across various health systems, with no set order for addressing the areas. Participants are encouraged to assess their institution's culture and climate to identify priorities and develop tailored strategies.
