Course Description:

This training introduces people who work with school-aged children on a daily basis what behaviors to expect and how best to respond to those behaviors after a disaster, as well as introducing to disaster workers what to expect and how to respond to children experiencing disaster. It offers a particularly close look at the different behavioral expectations among different child and adolescent minority populations, such as children with disabilities and Black, Indigenous, and other children of color, since these populations will likely have a different experience and view of disaster than their more sociologically privileged peers.
