General Information:

Camp is offered Monday - Thursday from Wednesday, June 26 through August 1, 2024.

Half Day Program:

(Campers ages 3-14)

SSC Provides:

• Individual Therapy Plan and Progress Summary:

A therapy plan is developed for all campers based on assessment results. At the end of SSC, a parent conerence is held to review the child's progress over the course of SSC.

• Evidence Based Intervention:

Children receive daily, intensive, therapy services in small and large groups. Unfortunately, our program is not designed to support individuals who require a one to one learning environment.

• Proficiency Training:

Our graduate clinicians receive supervision from certified, licensed, speech-language pathologists.

Eligibility:

• Age and Qualifications:

Applicants must be between the ages of 3 and 14. They must be able to participate in small and large group activities with others of the same age.

Recommendation:

Must be able to provide current IEP or documentation of speech therapy services and permission to speak with current speech-language pathologist.

Attendance:

Children are expected to attend all 21 days of SSC unless they are experiencing symptoms of illness.

Behavioral Considerations:

Prior to acceptance, the nature and severity of each individual's communication disorder are considered. Participants who demonstrate behaviors harmful to themselves or others or whose needs cannot be met in a group setting will not be considered for SSC. A child who demonstrates elopment or poses a significant wandering risk will not be eligible. Children with school behavior plans which require a para-professional or trained professional will not be eligible. Children may be admitted on a trial basis at the time of the evaluation. If the participant attends less than three weeks of the program due to behavior, SSC will provide a prorated tuition refund.
