Reporting to the president, I served as the Chief Academic Officer for the university and a member of the President's Executive Cabinet until July 8, 2024. In partnership with the faculty, the deans, the president, and the senior leadership team, I enhanced the academic quality in programs of instruction; fostered the development, support, and recognition for Augusta University faculty; drove services and programs that promoted the success of the university's students; promoted and supported a sense of belonging; advanced processes that tied budgeting and effective resource allocation to planning efforts; and ensured the university's infrastructure supported future growth while upholding the overall academic mission, and contributed to the pursuit of academic excellence.

In what can be described as a "Super-Provost" role, my direct reports included eleven college/school deans, the Dean of Libraires, the Dean of Augusta University Online, the Senior Vice President of Research, the Associate Vice President for Access, Success, and Belonging, the Vice President of Enrollment and Student Affairs, the Vice President of Institutional Effectiveness and Planning, the Vice Provost, and the Associate Vice President of Academic

Fiscal Affairs. I oversaw a budget of \$663 million, 1899 faculty, and a majority of the university's 4465 staff.

I served on the board of AU Health, Georgia's only public academic health system, until its merger with Wellstar in August 2023. AU Health was a \$1.2 billion health system, including Augusta University Medical Center, the Children's Hospital of Georgia, the Georgia Cancer Center, as well as numerous physician practices and ambulatory care centers.

As leader of the faculty and chief administrative officer for the fourth oldest college of pharmacy in the US, I provided strategic vision and operational leadership for faculty and staff organized into two divisions: pharmacy practice and administrative sciences and pharmaceutical sciences. I led an academic program that included a pharmacy (Pharm.D.) program, a M.S./Ph.D. graduate program in pharmaceutical sciences, and M.S. programs in drug development, cosmetic sciences, health outcomes, pharmacy leadership, pharmacogenomics, and three BS/MS dual degree co-op programs in cosmetic science. I assured that the school's programs were aligned with the university's mission and responsive to the needs of the marketplace. I advanced scholarship, education, and civic engagement, promoting initiatives within and outside of the University of Cincinnati. I served as the college's public voice, articulating its contributions to local, state, national and global communities, and pursued a development program to build the college's resources. I worked to advance excellence through building diversity in educational programs and in strategic faculty and

student recruitment, including linking the work of the school's faculty and students to other disciplines, communities, and interests within and outside of the academy. I reported to the university's Executive Vice President for Academic Affairs and Provost, collaborating closely with other senior leaders across the university, especially those in the academic health center. I was reappointed to a second, five-year term in June 2017.

At the university level, I participated and/or provided leadership in a number of areas, including (1) co-chair of the UC/UC Health Opioid Task Force, (2) member, UC Foundation Board of Directors, (3) member, UC Strategic Budget Working Group, (4) member, UC Enterprise Risk Management Risk Council, (5) member, Student Enrollment Management Policy Council, (6) co-chair of the Faculty and Staff Campaign, (7) chair of the advisory board for the undergraduate program in public health, and (8) chair, Council of Deans.
