

Central Michigan University First Destination Survey 2022 - 2023 Graduates

> Academic Planning & Analysis Central Michigan University March 2024

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Summary

The following table shows the status of students who graduated with an undergraduate degree from Central Michigan University between August of 2022 and June of 2023. The results of this table were found using three different avenues of research. These avenues included surveys conducted by the university (e.g., the First Destination Survey), a query to the National Student Clearinghouse (which maintains a listing of educational data), and through social media investigation (e.g., LinkedIn). Of the 2,500 graduating students, there were 1,277 students whose status was found using the survey, query, or social media for a knowledge rate of 51.1%. The status breakdown by source can be seen in the following table:

The information contained in the following document summarizes the data collected from undergraduate students who graduated from Central Michigan University in August, October, or December of 2022, or March, May, or June of 2023. These groups constitute a total of 2,500 graduates. Of these graduates, 483 (19.3%) completed employment questions on the Graduating Student Exit Survey only and 346 (13.8%) completed the First Destination Survey, resulting in a response rate of 33.1%. The respondents had a higher GPA than the nonrespondents in the graduating population (3.41 vs. 3.34) and consisted of more females (70% vs. 63%). Based on the results of the surveys, 60.8% of respondents were employed six months after graduating from CMU, while an additional 15.0% chose to continue their education.

Survey Results

Question 1: What is your employment status?

Employment results are separated by Graduating Student Exit Survey respondents (GSES) and First Destination Survey respondents (FDS). Students are less likely to be employed right after graduation and only FDS results are reported to National Association of Colleges and Employers (NACE).
